Walking through Lent – Intentionally – Week 2

Mark 8:31-38

Then he began to teach them that the Son of Man must undergo great suffering, and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and after three days rise again. He said all this quite openly. And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. But turning and looking at his disciples, he rebuked Peter and said, 'Get behind me, Satan! For you are setting your mind not on divine things but on human things.'

He called the crowd with his disciples, and said to them, 'if you want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it. For what will it profit them to gain the whole world and forfeit their life? Indeed, what can they give in return for their life? Those who are ashamed of me and of my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of them the Son of Man will also be ashamed when he comes in the glory of his Father with the holy angels.'

There are two things strike me as I read the above passage. Firstly, what Jesus predicts is a nonsense to Peter and does not fit with his preconception of how the Messiah would be. Yet from the perspective of Jesus, this would not be a random reaction against him, but part of the way the Love of God would gain victory over a world of darkness. So instead of suffering in this case being a random act, it becomes a purposeful part of the Kingdom of God breaking into this world.

The second thing is for all the gain that Christianity brings there is a cost to it. There is no way we can bypass that cost if we want to hold to a true expression of faith. That cost will mean different things to different people.

As we walk our life of faith do we recognise and face up to the cost to me of being a Christian, is there something I have been avoiding that is holding me back from drawing closer to Jesus Christ?
