High House Chapel made front page news on the Weardale Gazette this week, as it is likely to close in October this year. The chapel is the oldest Methodist chapel in continuous worship since 1760 where John Wesley preached several times. There is a memorial stone outside the building and several items of Wesley memorabilia in the adjacent museum which was the former manse. The chapel is on the A689 in Ireshopeburn, Weardale. Buses 101 & 102 stop outside and there is some parking adjacent to the museum. This is an opportunity for all Methodists to visit the chapel should they wish - it will need to be this year.
